How to Prepare for Effective Communication

Use a **PowerPoint template** to prepare your poster to produce a single sheet. The title should be bolded at the top center with the authors directly below and centered. To the upper left you should indicate your poster number, and directly below (left justified) place your abstract in a text box.

Poster Dimensions: Poster board : 90 cm wide x 140 cm high

Poster Content:

Title:

Introduction: A brief statement explaining why the abstract was done.

Methods: materials, methods, and any analytical procedures used.

Results: should be presented in sufficient detail to support the conclusions. If results are not yet available, then anticipated results should be included.

Brief discussion/conclusion/implications (take home message): the authors' opinion about the meaning of the study or results that are not yet available.

Poster Materials :

Ensure that information is securely fastened to the board or backing that you use. Each presenter is responsible for providing any material needed to hang the poster for viewing (e.g., thumbtacks) and for having the poster displayed by 8:00am on Friday, April 5th. The Networking and Posters session will be held on Friday April 5th, 2019.

Title :

The title should be a larger than the rest of the text. Authors and co-authors are listed below the title in a smaller text. Include affiliation of all authors.

Layout

Your poster sections should be sequential and symmetrical. Make sure to clearly label each section to help direct the reader to the flow of information. Maintain a consistent style throughout the poster.

Text of Poster :

Text should be large enough and of a style to be easily legible to a person standing 2-3 feet from the poster.

Make full use of the allotted space, but do not cram too much material on your poster. Be concise. Decide what is the most important and convey that information. Make sure there are no spelling or grammar errors.
